A CANCER ACTION STORY

At 46, Chris had a busy and active life. He was a successful entrepreneur, a husband and father of four who enjoyed spending time with his children. When he wasn't feeling up to par, Chris went to the doctor. In just a few days he found himself in the hospital with AML, a type of leukemia. Months of aggressive treatment, including a bone marrow transplant, placed a great deal of stress on Chris and his family.



Fortunately, Chris comes from a large family and his brother was a match for him. His close-knit family supported him throughout the long months of treatment and recovery. However, the financial strain from his inability to work began to take its toll. When he left the hospital he needed a very

expensive medication. Chris was referred to Cancer Action for help and we paid the cost of the medicine. We were able to relieve some of Chris' stress during this critical time of recovery, assistance that he greatly appreciates. Cancer Action was a game changer for Chris!

Chris is just one of over 3,000 patients who Cancer Action was able to help during this past year. If you have given your time, talent and financial support to us YOU are also a part of our team. SERVING OUR COMMUNITY IN 2015...TOGETHER WE CHANGE LIVES

For over **56 years**, Cancer Action has been dedicated to improving the lives of those with cancer in our community. We are grateful for the support of every person! We want to share with you the impact we made together this past year:

- Served over 3,071 cancer patients and their families, providing ongoing emotional support and guidance; including registering 1,392 new clients during the year.
- Provided over 17,500 "touchpoints" caring support by our professional Case Manager's to patients and their families throughout every step of their journey
- Supplied over 70,000 servings of nutritional supplements to more than 800 cancer patients to help them maintain their weight and energy during the rigors of cancer treatments
- Provided over 700 rides to life-saving or life-prolonging treatment and doctor appointments
- Filled over 2,200 prescriptions for those who could not afford their medication to relieve pain, nausea, treat infections and meet other supportive care needs
- Helped women going through treatment by providing 370 wigs and over 1,500 turbans and scarves
- Gave over **600** pieces of medical equipment to help families members care for their loved ones during their cancer journey
- Distributed over **33,000** medical supplies to support cancer patients and decrease the financial burden of cancer
- Assisted 90 women with mastectomy supplies, lymphedema sleeves or breast prosthesis
- 43 families were adopted through our "Making Wishes Come True" holiday adoption program, touching 153 adults and children that were financially impacted by a cancer diagnosis.

CANCER ACTION VOLUNTEERS GIVING TIME AND TOUCHING HEARTS

Cancer Action volunteers are dedicated, compassionate and faithful in giving of their time and many talents to offer support to cancer patients and their families. Cancer Action couldn't do our work without you! Here are just a few examples of how Cancer Action Volunteers gave of their time in 2015 lifting spirits and touching hearts:

In 2015, volunteers gave over **36,551** hours of service!

Volunteers donated **352** hours supporting special events and fundraising

Volunteers drove over **12,371** miles and spent over **680** hours transporting cancer patients to their doctor and treatment appointments

Over **2,304** hours were donated by those helping our three offices run smoothly and bulk mail volunteers.

Approximately **33**, **202** hours were given to provide comfort and care items to our clients through individuals and our service groups

Several hundred hours moving office space, organizing store room, health fairs, and courier work.
