Cancer patients, especially those receiving treatment, are at higher risk for contracting COVID-19. Therefore, those fighting cancer have had unparalleled challenges due the impact of the current health crisis. Many cancer patients are facing financial and emotional difficulties that are overwhelming.

Cancer Action has been a critical support for these cancer patients and families, offering financial assistance and providing emotional support and guidance, helping them navigate this difficult time.

Like many nonprofits, we faced a myriad of challenges as an organization during this past year. The agency had to pivot quickly to

offer services and support in a safe and effective manner. We worked diligently with our partners in the cancer centers across the metro to establish procedures ensuring that cancer patients received the vital services they needed to reduce their distress and improve their well-being.

We were proactive in reaching out to our clients financially impacted to connect them with resources they needed to meet their essential needs, while also helping to meet their medical needs. Whether paying for their medications, providing nutritional support while they go through the rigors of cancer treatment, making sure they have medical supplies and equipment, ensuring women who are experiencing hair loss have a wig and headwear or offering vital support through our caring case managers -Cancer Action was there for some of the most vulnerable cancer patients in our community.

Cancer Action will also remember all of those who stepped up during 2020 so we could continue to provide the services and support cancer patients so desperately needed. While the agency struggled with the loss of grant dollars and support from in-person special events, many individuals and groups were there for us. The phrase "when the going gets tough, the tough get going" comes to mind as I think of the work and effort many of our friends and supporters expended to do something to help! Their determination to overcome obstacles and find ways to safely raise funds made a huge difference. Our Champions for Survivorship Breakfast became our first ever virtual event, and was a great success!

In a year like no other, it took fortitude and resolve to face the challenges and demands that seemed to change almost daily. Our Cancer Action board of directors and leadership team provided great oversight to guide the agency through this time, utilizing our resources as prudently as possible to ensure we continued to maintain our high level of care and support

Indeed, 2020 will be a memorable year. While much had to change, the very "heart" of the organization remained the same, sustained by compassionate caring people. Cancer Action remains strong in its mission to offer support through every step of the cancer journey!

Serving Our Community... Cancer Action's Impact in 2020

2020, a year to remember. Much will be remembered about this past year. Those with cancer remember the day they were told "you have cancer." They remember those who stood with them during their struggle. Those in our community living with cancer have faced significant challenges and have had overwhelming needs. With the support of caring people, Cancer Action will be remembered for coming alongside them, lifting them up, bridging the gap, offering desperately needed support to help them through this time of crisis. But we couldn't do it without the help of our volunteers and donors!

- Supplied almost 50,000 servings of nutritional supplements to more than 375 cancer patients to help maintain their weight and energy during cancer treatment.
- Provided 40 rides to life-saving or life-prolonging treatment and doctor appointments.
- Filled approximately 1,000 prescriptions for those who could not afford their medication to relieve pain, nausea, treat infections and meet other cancer supportive care needs.
- Helped women going through treatment by providing almost 90 wigs and over 300 turbans and scarves. This program was also suspended in March 2020 due to COVID-19 and resumed July 1, 2020 with safety protocols in place.
- Issued over 215 pieces of medical equipment to help families members care for their loved ones.
- Distributed **approximately 9,000 medical supplies** to support cancer patients and decrease the financial burden of cancer decrease the financial burden of cancer.
- Gave out over **2,700 bed pads and 2,139 comfort items** (afghans, pillows).
- Our case managers went the extra mile to provide ongoing emotional support, guidance and education to all of our clients, helping deal with the impact of the pandemic; and also helped hundreds who called requesting assistance from our community.


